# Your Initial Visit

Your first visit can be stressful. We'll walk you through the whole process and make sure to answer all of your questions.

- 1. Registration A patient access representative will meet with you to review insurance benefits and sign initial forms.
- 2. Imaging and lab tests You will meet with a member of your health care team to complete medical tests.
- 3. Consultation Your care team will review your test results and medical history. Your doctor will then perform a physical exam. With this information, your care team will develop and discuss a treatment plan that is unique to you. They will take the time to explain treatment options that are best for you.
- 4. Outpatient instructions All appointments and cancer support services will be explained.

# For Your Safety

Your health and safety are our top priorities from the moment you arrive to the moment you leave. Many security systems are in place to ensure your safety and security, including an in-house security department, which provides many services for patients and visitors 24 hours a day.



OSF MyChart offers secure 24/7 access to your electronic medical record, where your health history is stored.

With OSF MyChart, you or a designated family member can:

- View your medical history, test results and clinical notes
- Send messages to your care team
- Schedule and check in for appointments, including video visits
- Request medication refills
- Access your child's records

You can access OSF MyChart from a computer or download the MyChart app to your phone or tablet.

View your information on the go with the mobile app. Available for Apple and Android devices.

# Language Interpreters and Communication Assistance

OSF HealthCare is committed to accessible care for all patients, including those with disabilities or limited English. # Social Services

Our purpose is to provide referral services to our patients and help to connect them to an array of social services available in the community to address issues, such as emotional and psychological concerns, counseling and support groups, grief counseling, care coordination, follow-up treatment or rehabilitation, home-based support services and medical equipment or transportation. If you or your family need assistance, please ask to speak to a nurse navigator or a social worker.

# Spiritual Care

## **Advance Directives**

You have the right to decide about the health care you get now and in the future. An advance directive is a written statement you prepare that expresses how you want medical decisions made in the future should you not be able to make them yourself. They can be stored and retrieved by those who need to know about them.

Federal law requires you to be told of your right to make an advance directive when admitted to a health care facility. The Patient Self-Determination Act requires certain providers participating in the Medicare and Medicaid programs to furnish patients with information on advance directives.

#### What is advance care planning?

Advance care planning is deciding the types of medical care you want in the future, based on your current state of health and your values and beliefs, and discussing them with your family and health care providers.

#### What is the purpose of advance care planning?

The purpose of advance care planning is to help you determine your preferences for future medical care and to have them known by others if you are hospitalized but cannot speak for yourself because of your medical condition. It is more than completing a Power of Attorney for Health Care form.

#### Power of Attorney for Health Care

Power of Attorney for Health Care is a legal document that allows you to appoint a person you know and trust as your Health Care Agent to make medical decisions for you if you become temporarily or permanently unable to make these decisions yourself.

#### Provider Orders for Life-Sustaining Treatment

Do Not Resuscitate (DNR) is a legal order written either in the hospital or on a legal form and signed by the patient or their Health Care Agent directing the medical team not to perform CPR. For some patients with certain medical conditions, it is known in advance that CPR will not be successful or it may leave them worse off.

#### Living Will

This type of advance directive only applies if you are terminally ill or permanently unconscious. It is very limited and typically only tells the doctor what you do not want. It is not the same as a Do Not Resuscitate (DNR) order.

#### **OSF** Care Decisions

OSF Care Decisions is a program developed by OSF HealthCare to help patients think about health care decisions they would want made on their behalf if patients become unable to make decisions themselves. This program supports the belief that everyone should be given the information they need to make future decisions based on their values and spiritual and religious beliefs.

# SUPPORT SERVICES

Life takes on a whole new meaning when you are diagnosed with cancer. In addition to adverse physical effects, cancer treatment has countless social and emotional effects - not just for patients but for their families, friends and co-workers.

OSF Cancer Support Services provides services for cancer patients and their families that effectively help them manage the physical and emotional side effects of cancer diagnosis, treatment and recovery. We provide the comfort and support needed for a healthier survival. The more you understand and participate in your care, the more you become part of your health care team.

#### SERVICES OFFERED

# Advanced Practice Provider (APP) support

- APPs meet with newly diagnosed cancer patients to assess and manage symptoms, provide education and order additional testing, if needed.
- Low Dose CT Lung Screening Program: Patients who qualify for this program are scanned on a yearly basis, and an APP follows up with results and recommendations.
- High Risk and Genetics Clinic: For those who have been identified as being at higher risk for developing cancer or have a personal history of cancer, an APP will meet with them to determine what next steps are needed, if genetic testing would be helpful, and determine a personalized course of action.
- Rapid Workup Clinic: When a suspicious lesion is identified after a patient undergoes a CT scan, our APPs will determine what action is needed – all to find and treat cancers early.

## Nurse Navigation

Nurse navigators answer questions and help navigate the journey of a cancer diagnosis. They assist patients and their families with education, advocacy, assessing needs, coordination of care and tests, and follow-up throughout cancer treatment.

# Nutritional Support

Nutrition plays a vital role during cancer treatment. Our registered dietitians will work with you to ensure you get the proper nutrition to maintain strength and energy throughout your treatment.

Individual consultations are tailored to your specific needs and preferences. The dietitian can help you manage symptoms such as:

- Poor appetite
- Dry or sore mouth
- Taste changes
- Difficulty swallowing

- Nausea and vomiting
- Diarrhea or constipation
- Weight loss or weight gain

LEAN on Me: LEAN (Lifestyle, Exercise and Nutrition) on Me is a six-month program for breast cancer patients who have completed treatment. Facilitated by our oncologycertified staff, it's designed to help you achieve a healthy lifestyle. With a focus on incorporating healthy food choices, promoting physical activity and exploring the science of how habits are formed, the LEAN on Me group will share your journey to wellness and celebrate your successes. **If you're interested in joining this free group, please call (844) OSF-4HOPE (844-673-4467).** 

# Behavioral Health and **Counseling Support**

Cancer patients and survivors experience many different emotions through their first treatment and beyond. OSF Cancer Support Services provides counselors to help you work through these feelings.

Patients may ask why they got cancer or survived when others didn't. They may find themselves rethinking beliefs, questioning previous life experiences or even finding new meanings in life. Every person creates meaning from their cancer journey in their own way.

Stress, guilt, depression and isolation are just a few of the emotions that may be felt and are completely normal. Our counseling team offers:

- Emotional support
- Relaxation techniques
- · Behavioral techniques for habit changes
- Group connections
- Supportive resources for children

# **Financial Support**

# High Risk and Genetics Clinic

The cause of cancer is often unknown. However, around 10% of cancers occur because of an inherited genetic abnormality, which leads to a hereditary cancer syndrome. Hereditary cancer syndromes can increase the risk of developing various cancers and can be passed down from generation to generation through the mother or father.

Knowing this information is one important factor in determining the likelihood of developing a disease in the future. Indicators that a hereditary cancer syndrome may be present include:

- Cancer in adults that occurs at an earlier Personal history or a family member age than usual (typically diagnosed under age 50)
- Multiple family members with the same kind of cancer or personal history of some types of cancer
- Specific combinations of cancers in a family, such as breast and ovarian or both colon and uterine
- that has two separate cancers involving the same organ of the body (e.g., cancer involving both breasts or two different sites in the colon)
- Ashkenazi Jewish ancestry
- · Relative with a gene mutation associated with hereditary cancer

The High Risk and Genetics Clinic was created to help people concerned about their chances of developing cancer or who may be at risk for hereditary cancers. A consultation with our specially trained professionals will help you understand your level of risk and will provide you with an individualized plan based on your risk factors. Your treatment team will gather your personal and family history to determine if genetic testing is needed to assist with treatment decisions.

## Intimacy Clinic

Sometimes, surgical procedures are part of cancer treatment, and those that alter the body can affect body image and cause ongoing pain. Intimacy issues and concerns after surgery or radiation are real and are noted as a major source of distress among cancer survivors. The side effects are debilitating, and the combined feelings and beliefs associated with intimacy can lead to avoidance and increased anxiety within relationships.

The Intimacy Clinic at OSF Cancer Support Services provides a multidisciplinary approach to rehabilitation. Our team of experts is specially trained to help with these concerns. The team consists of an advanced practice provider, pelvic floor physical therapist and counselor who work together to help manage and improve intimacy.

# Fighting Cancer with Exercise

Exercise improves brain and heart health, improves sleep, releases "feel good" hormones, improves concentration and alertness, and combats cancer treatment fatigue. An exercise physiologist can help you develop an exercise plan specifically for you and your needs and help keep you motivated to move through the different stages of your cancer journey.

- Appointments in group settings

# **Oncology Rehabilitation**

Oncology rehabilitation through OSF Rehabilitation is a resource during any part of the cancer journey. Dedicated physical therapists, occupational therapists and speech therapists collaborate with patients and survivors to achieve the most favorable health and maximum function.

# Cardio-Oncology Clinic

Cancer survival rates continue to improve due to better treatment options. However, treatment can lead to negative side effects, including damage to your heart. Patients most susceptible to negative heart side effects include those at risk for heart disease before cancer diagnosis.

Our cardio-oncology program works to prevent, monitor and treat cardiovascular disease in cancer survivors and patients to ensure long-term health. After being referred, you'll meet with one of our doctors for a comprehensive evaluation, and our team will develop your individualized treatment plan.

Treatment varies according to the type of heart condition you have, your progress, whether you have any other underlying conditions and whether you're currently being treated for cancer.

Our program brings together experts in radiology, oncology and cardiology to provide optimal cardiovascular care during and after treatment, including:

- Risk assessment before cancer treatment
- Care for patients with cancer who have existing cardiovascular disease, such as hypertension, coronary artery disease, congestive heart failure, heart valve disease and arrhythmias
- Monitor for cardiac complications during cancer therapy
- Care for patients who have cardiac side effects from traditional cancer therapies
- Assessment of cardiac risks related to new or changing cancer therapies
- Assessment of long-term cardiac risk in cancer survivors

# **Oncology** Massage

An oncology massage is massage techniques that safely nurture the body of someone affected by cancer or cancer treatments. Clinical research shows that these massages can improve some side effects of cancer treatments, reduce pain and fatigue, decrease anxiety and nausea, improve sleep and help with peripheral neuropathy.

You and your family can get hands-on experience with healthy eating. Our dietitians use fresh produce from the garden to teach you how to cook nutritious meals and strategies for handling cancer treatment side effects. A variety of classes are offered each week.

On the east side of the center, the Patient Garden provides a forest path that includes a water feature, grotto, glade, teaching garden and statues of St. Francis of Assisi and the Virgin Mary. Additional gardens around the center are the North Garden, Arrival Garden and Forest Park with St. Peregrine, patron saint of cancer, in the front. Patients also are invited to visit the outdoor terrace, located on the third floor on the south side of the building.
