

GENERAL OVERVIEW



STEP 01

Obtain and analyze data/information; present it to the McLean County Community Health Council for discussion.

STEP **02**

Prioritize the top 7 health issues and choose the top 3 health priorities for the joint 2022 McLean County CHNA and the joint 2023--2025 McLean County Community Health Improvement Plan.

STEP **03**

Form a Priority Action Team for each of the 3 health priorities.

STEP **04**

Compose the 2022 McLean County CHNA.

STEP 05

Approve CHNA document and post on 4 websites for all to use.

Top 7 Issues

- Access to Care
- Behavioral Health (Mental Health and Substance Use)

BEHAVIORAL HEALTH

McLean County is in the worst 25th percentile compared to other counties in Illinois for:

ER visits due to adolescent (10-17 years) suicide and intentional self-inflicted injury



ER visits due to alcohol use and adults who binge drink (18+ years)

McLean County is in the best 50th percentile compared to other counties in Illinois for:

- ER rate due to adult mental health
- ER rate due to substance use
- ER rate due to opioid use
- Deaths due to drug poisoning
- Adults who smoke
- Teens who use marijuana, smoke or use alcohol
- Death rate due to suicide







- An average of 40% of youth surveyed reported feeling sad or hopeless
- An average of 15% of youth surveyed reported seriously considering attempting suicide
- McLean County is in the worst 50th 75th percentile for ageadjusted ER visits due to pediatric (< age 18) mental health and adult suicide and intentional self-inflicted injuries compared to other counties in Illinois.
- 18% of McLean County adults surveyed rated their mental health as poor



ACCESS

20% of survey respondents rated "ACCESS TO HEALTH SERVICES"

as an issue that impacts well-being



REASONS survey respondents reported not accessing medical care were:

- TOO LONG TO WAIT
- COULD NOT AFFORD COPAY

18% of survey respondents reported not having access to dental care





16% of at-risk County residents surveyed reported that the **EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT** was their primary choice of medical care...

...as compared to **4%** of the general population

McLean County is ranked as #2 in the State of Illinois for clinical care

HEALTHY EATING / ACTIVE LIVING (HEAL)











- 86% of McLean County residents are not meeting exercise guidelines (150 minutes per week); 28% report being too tired to exercise,
 23% report they don't like to exercise
- **94%** of McLean County residents do not consume 5+ servings of fruit and vegetables per day; citing transportation issues or "don't like"
- **9.5%** of people in McLean County experience food insecurity
- **31%** of adults (18+) are obese; **34.6%** of adults (18+) are obese in the 10 socioneeds ZIP codes with a 4-5 ranking
- 27% of 8th, 10th and 12th graders reported being physically active for a total of 60 minutes per day for 7 days a week
- McLean County is in the worst 25th percentile compared to other IL counties for access to a grocery store
- **84%** of McLean County residents live reasonably close to a park or recreation facility
