IV. UPDATE FROM IDPH/STATE MEETING

A. UPDATES FROM IDPH RHCC MEETING

- 1. FY 2022 grant deliverables discussed. Randy will present more information during June's meeting.
- 2. Vaccinations have been the focal point during meetings.
- 3. The Ebola is currently a low risk; members are encouraged to update plans.
- 4. FY 2020 grant expires in June. FY 2021 grant will receive the no cost grant extension. This extension will expire January 31, 2022.

B. UPDATES FROM MIKE EPPING (REMSC)

- 1. The CHEMPACK switch out will be a "Drop-Ship" (instead of an in-person visit).
- 2. The product shipped on 5/11/2021. The "window" for making the switch will be 5/11/2021 through 5/14/2021.
- 3. If hospitals are unable to make the switch out during the window time or need completed after the 14th, contact ASPR with this information. FYI the alarm will sound off if the CHEMPACK unit is open outside the 3-day window.

C. UPDATES FROM MATT RIGENBERG (ERC)

- 1. Vaccine shipment projected to arrive within the next couple of weeks.
- 2. Pfizer should be available for the community the following week from today. More to come.
- 3. Johnson & Johnson vaccine still on board with allocations for next week, not sure about future allocations.
- 4. IDPH will be setting up units with a rapid 1-2 day clinics to help with administering vaccination.

D. UPDATES FROM REGION 2 EMS COMMITTEE

- 1. Tom Stecher stated that a meeting scheduled for noon today.
- 2. Randy Haley will check back with him before next meeting for updates.

A. HHS-ASPR CAT

B. Strategic Plan/regional Plan

- 1. Randy discussed the Region 2 charter; updates were St. Margaret's Peru. The plan submitted to ASPR-CAT; IDPH made recommendations to add an Emergency Management voting member from the group to the plan.
 - a. St. Margaret's Health Peru is now the Region 2 Emergency Management voting member.
 - First motion to approve document by Tobey Beagle (UPH - Pekin and second by Doug Sampson (Galesburg Cottage Hospital). No objections or oppositions. Motioned approved.

C. Healthcare Response Coordination

- 1. FATMAN plan reviewed and Randy discussed changes made by the committee. He will add the fatality management trailers and mobile morgue information.
 - a. In the plan under section, **"Why refrigeration is recommended"** quantiles changed to quantity bodies.
 - b. In the plan under section "Hospital Morgue Capacity" St. Margaret's Hospital – Streator should read St. Margaret's Hospital – Spring Valley.
 - c. Adam Sowells stated that UPH-Trinity now has 4 available morgue beds.
 - i. First motion to approve document by Zachary Vankeulen (OSF Saint Paul Medical Center) and second by Frank Lung (OSF Holy Family Medical Center). No objections or oppositions. Motioned approved.

D. Continuity of Healthcare

1. The state is still reviewing these documents inventory assessment, inventory management and burn annex

E. Medical Surge

- 1. Infectious Disease Plan submitted last year, IDPH had updates and revisions. Randy will get a meeting scheduled to discuss updates. All updates/revisions will need completed by June.

A. PPE Updates

- a. There were only two places to get PPE equipment, OSF and Grainger. Grainger quote was cheaper however; Tim McCarthy with Grainger stated that they are unable to get the amount requested of N95's.
- b. Randy contacted CSC through OSF; they have mask available to purchase. Randy discussed the quote for members to vote on. Members voted yes for purchase of N95 mask through CSC.
- c. Available mask: \$87.00 case
 - 1860 \$4.33 each
 - 1860s \$4.39 each
 - There will be a totaled of 16,000 mask for the region.
 - i. First motion to approve N95 mask by Sarah Stuepfert (St. Margaret's - Peru) and second by Frank Lung (OSF Holy Family Medical Center). No objections or oppositions. Motioned approved.

B. Grant Updates

- a. FY 2022 grant, a forklift and morgue trailer approved for purchase. Randy received updated quotes. Quotes will have to go through OSF purchasing for approval. Meeting scheduled with purchasing on April 19, 2021. Order placed once approved.
- b. Randy shared video presentation of the mobile morgue RHCC will purchase. It is 20ft and the capacity is 24. Estimated time to build, 3-4 weeks after ordered.
