Farewell to Dr. Jan Boundy

Nurse, educator, leader, innovator, change agent, role model, and mentor. These are just some words that describe Dr. Jan Boundy, Dean of the Graduate Program. As many of you know, Dr. Boundy retired at the end of June after a 54 year career

of nursing and nursing education at Saint Francis. In May of this year, Dr. Boundy attended her final graduation ceremony. In her 54 years of nursing education, Dr. Boundy has been present at 26 diploma student graduations, 55 BSN student graduations, 22 MSN student

graduations, and 5 DNP student graduations. She has contributed to the education and has been present for the graduation of over 4000 thousand nurses who entered the workforce to provide quality patient care.

In 1961, Dr. Boundy earned her diploma in nursing from St. Francis Hospital School of Nursing. Shortly after her graduation, she began her teaching career at St. Francis Hospital School of Nursing teaching medical nursing. Many alumni, who had Dr. Boundy as a teacher, love to tell "Mrs. Boundy or Dr. Boundy stories" about how she taught them and challenged them to be better nurses. Many of the College's current faculty had Dr. Boundy as a teacher during their nursing

education. During her career, she went on to earn her BS in Nursing from Bradley University, an MSN from Northern Illinois University and a PhD in Educational Administration from Illinois State University. As she advanced her

education, she took on increasing responsibility and leadership roles befitting of her education, knowledge, skills, and talents.

The BSN, MSN and DNP programs are in operation today in a large part due to Dr. Boundy's passion and dedication

to nursing education. She was a key member of the Steering Committee that helped to develop the BSN program in the 1980s and was the leading force behind the development and growth of both the MSN and DNP programs. She has served as the Director and then Dean of the Graduate programs since their start. Her willingness to be innovative, listen to student needs, and be a leader in education is what moved the College into distance education and offering the graduate programs online.

Through her career, Dr. Boundy has been the recipient of a number of awards. She was given the OSF Saint Francis Medical Center Heritage Hall of Fame Legend Award. She was the recipient of the Sister





Message from the President

Dear Alumni and Friends,

As I write this letter to you – our over 4000 alumni, we are celebrating 110 years of providing quality education to nurses, first as St. Francis Hospital School of Nursing followed by Saint Francis Medical Center College of Nursing. 2014-2015 was once again a very busy year for the College. I am looking forward to the new adventures and challenges that will be coming in the 2015-2016 year.

I would like to highlight the accomplishments of the College through this year. We are truly proud of the accomplishments for the 2014-2015 year. Here are some highlights:

- We had a fall 2014 enrollment of 676 students and 636 students who were enrolled in spring 2015. Summer 2015 enrollment stands at 301 students.
- The College offered two cultural immersion courses for students this summer. One student group provided healthcare education and assisted with healthcare needs of a population in the Dominican Republic and the second group worked with public health nurses providing healthcare in the small town of Bethel, Alaska.
- The College graduated 85 BSN, 24 MSN, 1 DNP and 1 Post-graduate Certificate students in December 2014. In May 2015, the College celebrated the graduation of 105 BSN, 35 MSN, 3 Post-graduate Certificate and 5 DNP graduates.
- The College continued its implementation of the revised BSN curriculum. The revised curriculum is a concept-based curriculum that is built upon active learning. Active learning is an integral part of nursing education and helps to promote critical thinking, priority setting, and clinical decision making. The final two semesters of the revised curriculum will be implemented in 2015-2016.
- The College hosted its annual Scholarship Donor Reception in October 2014 with approximately 300 donors and recipients present. We awarded \$151,000 in scholarships to 134 students. For the first time this year, we awarded scholarships from the Ada Oetgen Memorial Scholarship Fund which was established in Miss Oetgen's honor with her generous \$1.5 million dollar gift to the College upon her death in 2014.

The College said farewell this year to faculty and staff members who are leaving us with long histories of service and teaching excellence. Dr. Jan Boundy, Dean of the Graduate Program, is retiring after 54 years of service to nursing and nursing education (See related story). Also retiring were Patricia Schwarzentraub and Janie White. Julie Deibel, faculty, left to pursue a position as a Family Nurse Practitioner and Sheree Lamprecht left to pursue another opportunity in nursing. We wish them all well in their new adventures!

As economic times continue to be challenging, we remain focused on increasing endowments and scholarships for our students. The continued decrease in federal and state funding for student financial aid presents challenges to the students. Eighty-three percent of the BSN students received financial assistance of some type during 2014-2015. During 2014-2015, there were 270 BSN students getting federal direct and alternative (private) loans for a total of \$2,558,036 in student loans.

You can make a difference for a student! In honor of our 110 years of nursing education, I ask that you consider making a \$110 gift to the College of Nursing Scholarship Fund.

You are a very important part of the College family and it is our goal to stay connected with you. I hope to see you on September 19, 2015 at the Alumni Weekend activities. I hope you can join us to help celebrate 110 years of nursing education at Saint Francis!

Aeterna OSF Mission Integration Award in recognition of her witness to the Mission of OSF to serve with the greatest care and love. In 2005, Saint Francis Medical Center College of Nursing honored Dr. Boundy with two awards, the Alumni Hall of Fame Award and the Outstanding Alumni Educator Award. In 2015, she was a WEEK-TV 25 Women in Leadership award recipient, in recognition of her leadership in nursing, nursing education, her Tremont community, and the College of Nursing.

During her professional career, Dr. Boundy has served as a consultant for numerous nursing education programs across the country. She has also served as a program evaluator and panel review member for the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN; formerly National League for Accrediting Commission [NLNAC]). Dr. Boundy was active in the Illinois League for Nursing (ILN) serving as the coordinator and faculty for the NCLEX-RN Review Course offered by ILN for many years. She is also a member of Sigma Theta Tau International Honor Society of Nursing.

Dr. Boundy has contributed to the profession of nursing through her multiple contributions as textbook and textbook chapter reviewer and contributor. In 2004, she was the coauthor of the published nursing textbook, Calculations of Medication Dosages. Dr. Boundy has co-authored a number of grants throughout her career.

As busy as Dr. Boundy was in her professional career, she was very active in her Tremont community. She was very involved with the Tremont Rescue 702 Squad as a volunteer and Education coordinator. Later she was an active member of the Tremont Area Park Board, serving as Vice-President, President, and Secretary. She was also the co-director of the Tri-Tremont Triathlon for 12 years. She served as an American Heart Association Basic Life Support Instructor for over 20 years.

A number of years ago, the Graduate Program in conjunction with the College's Tau Omicron chapter of Sigma Theta Tau International Honor Society of Nursing, sponsored the first Research Day for the College of Nursing. This has now become an annual event. In recognition of Dr.

Boundy's leadership in the development and sponsorship of this event, the College is proud to announce that starting this fall Tau Omicron and the Graduate Program will be hosting the Dr. Jan Boundy Research Day. Dr. Boundy has truly left a lasting legacy for the College and we will all miss her! We all wish Dr. Boundy well in her retirement!

When is a Gift More Than a Gift?

Have you ever received the perfect gift? One that is both personal and useful? The gift that you appreciated and knew gave the person who gave the gift that great feeling down deep? It's the hallmark of a great relationship!

Saint Francis Medical Center College of Nursing continues to be blessed by the thoughtful gifts of many alumni and friends. We are deeply grateful. As we celebrate 110 years of educating and preparing outstanding nurses, we are happy to offer information that may help you to realize multiple objectives as you consider ways to make the perfect gift in support of the College.

The truth is, most people are surprised by the benefits of charitable gift planning. Careful planning actually makes it possible to enjoy personal (or family) benefits and realize your charitable goals and dreams. The Charitable Gift Annuity is a perfect example of this.

An Annuity -- And a Gift

A Charitable Gift Annuity (CGA) combines two ideas. As an Annuity it creates an annual income stream for you, at the same time, it creates a Charitable Gift for the future. In practical terms, a CGA through OSF Healthcare Foundation to support the Saint Francis College of Nursing is a contract between OSF and an individual or couple. This contract provides fixed, secure payments to a donor (or donors) for life and an ultimate gift to College in the future. Additionally, your gift through a CGA can be designated to support any area of the College, including scholarship opportunities.



Here is how the agreement can work:

Mrs. Jones gives a gift to create a \$15,000 CGA with OSF Healthcare Foundation to support Saint Francis Medical Center College of Nursing. OSF provides fixed, secure annuity payments for Mrs. Jones' lifetime. Rates range as high as 9.0% and are based on the age of the annuitant. At age 75, the rate for Mrs. Jones on a \$15,000 CGA guarantees her annual payments of 5.80% with an effective payout rate of 9.38%. This translates to \$870.00 income for Mrs. Jones each year. And, because this is a charitable gift, a portion of each annuity payment would be tax-free . . . further reducing tax liability. This portion is also based on the age of the annuitant. For Mrs. Jones, \$674.25 of her annual payment would be tax-free.

But the benefits do not end with the attractive annuity rate. Because the end result of this contract is a charitable gift to the College through a qualified 501c3 like the OSF Healthcare Foundation, a number of charitable tax benefits are also generated. A formula calculates the value of the ultimate gift to charity and provides for an immediate charitable income tax deduction that Mrs. Jones can enjoy now. In this example, a charitable income tax deduction of approximately \$6,639 would be generated. Additionally, if the CGA is funded with an appreciated asset, such as stock or property, Mrs. Jones may avoid capital gains on the appreciation.
