What is SDOH?

SDOH are economic or social conditions that impact a person's health. All adult inpatients must be screened for five SDOH domains during each hospital admission, including **housing, transportation, food insecurity, interpersonal violence, and utilities**. Screening can be completed via MyChart on their mobile device, MyChart Bedside tablet, or verbally by the nurse.

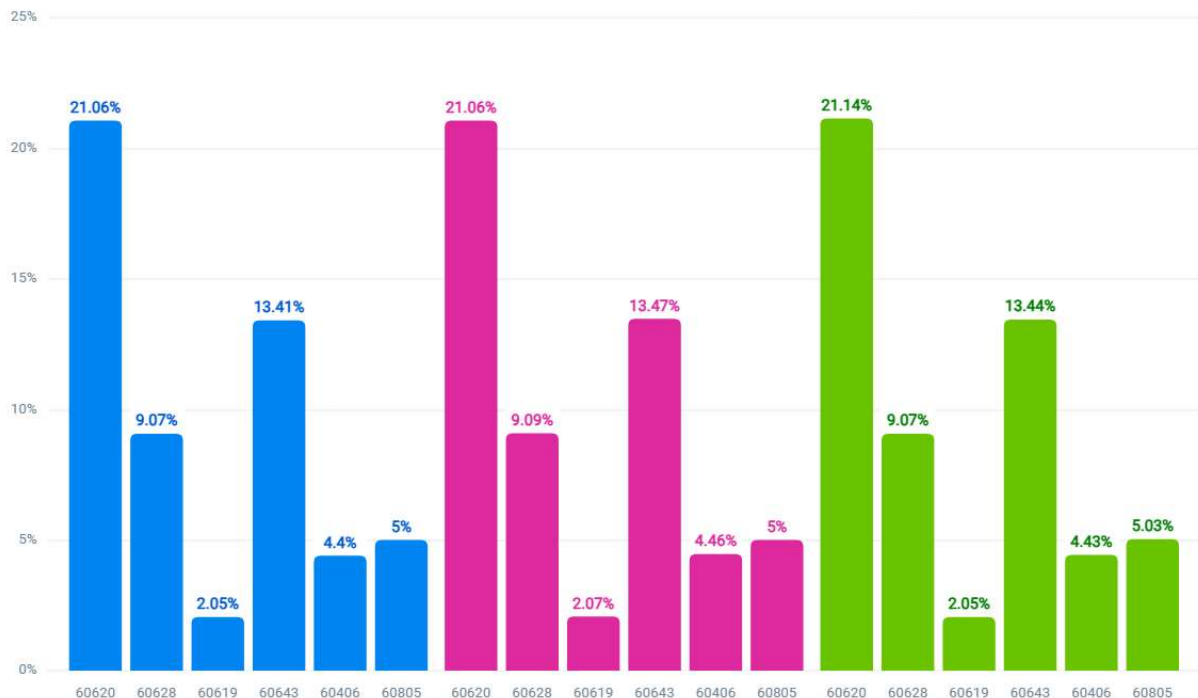
Why screen for SDOH?

- Screening for SDOH and identifying needs provides an opportunity to connect patients with assistance prior to discharge
- Data collected helps OSF better understand the needs of patients and find comprehensive ways to address these needs to improve health equity
- SDOH screenings are a requirement of the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid and the Joint Commission.
