

What is harm reduction?

Harm reduction is a compassionate and practical approach to addressing drug use and its associated risks. It aims to minimize the harm caused by drug use without requiring abstinence or judgment. Here's what you need to know:

Harm reduction is based on the belief that everyone deserves respect, dignity and the opportunity to live a healthier life. By adopting this approach, we can create safer communities and support individuals and families impacted by addiction and overdose.

Non-judgmental support

Harm reduction treats drug use as a complex issue that requires understanding and empathy. It supports individuals without stigmatizing or blaming them.

Safer substance use

Harm reduction promotes strategies that reduce the risks associated with drug use, such as providing clean needles, syringes and safe disposal options to prevent the spread of infections like HIV and hepatitis C.

Overdose prevention

Harm reduction educates individuals and their families on recognizing and responding to drug overdoses. It advocates for the widespread availability and training in administering naloxone, a medication that can reverse opioid overdoses.

Accessible health care

Harm reduction emphasizes access to health care services, including substance use treatment, mental health support and counseling, to improve overall wellbeing and help individuals lead healthier lives.

Education and awareness

Harm reduction initiatives aim to increase awareness about the risks and effects of drug use, including safer use practices, to empower individuals to make informed decisions about their health.

Community engagement

Harm reduction encourages collaboration between community members, service providers and policymakers to develop and implement effective strategies, policies and services that meet the needs of individuals who use drugs.

MAR NOW connects callers to immediate treatment for opioid use disorder, including telephonic prescription and home induction on buprenorphine or same-day clinic appointments for methadone, buprenorphine or naltrexone. MAR NOW can also connect patients to withdrawal management and residential treatment. Callers asking for opioid treatment between 6 a.m. - 10 p.m. seven days a week will be immediately connected to a provider. After hours, callers will leave a message and receive a call back the next day.
