OSF HealthCare Saint Katharine Medical Center in Dixon, Illinois, was established in 1897 by Judge Solomon H. Bethea in memory of his late wife, Katherine. This 80-bed hospital serves the Sauk Valley area in Northwestern Illinois and includes eight clinics offering primary and specialty care services.

In 2025, OSF Saint Katharine became part of the OSF HealthCare Ministry, a Catholic health network with 18 inpatient facilities serving Illinois and the Upper Peninsula of Michigan, dedicated to the Mission of serving with the greatest care and love.
