S2s Registration Process

- Academic Advisor will release registration hold
- Student registers online in SONIS beginning Monday, October 6, 2025 at 8 am to Thursday, October 9, 2025 at 4 pm.

Academic Advisement

- All BSN students MUST meet individually with his/her Academic Advisor. It is the student's responsibility to make an appointment to see the advisor.
- J2 and S1 students will register by selecting course bundles versus individual
 courses and sections. This will greatly reduce scheduling conflicts for students. It is
 recommended that you choose at least three bundles in case your first selections
 are unavailable. In the meeting with the Academic Advisor, the student and the
 advisor will email the Registrar with the students three preferred bundle choices.
- S2 students will register themselves online.
- Students will not be registered for courses if they have delinquent financial obligations to the College or to financial aid programs.
- Students interested in enrolling part time will use the list of courses and sections in a bundle to create a schedule. Students are required to discuss their desired schedule with their academic advisor who will email the request to the Registrar.
- The College reserves the right to limit enrollment in sections and to cancel a section for which there are insufficient registrations. The size of a clinical group is determined by limitations set by the clinical agency. The College reserves the right to change or adjust course and clinical or lab schedules of students, as needed.

Asynchronous learning is any type of learning that is undertaken on the student's own schedule and does not require consistent real-time interactions with an instructor.

Synchronous learning can be done online or in-person and typically requires students to attend scheduled classes with the instructor.

Hybrid learning combines in-person and online learning experiences.

Student Account

- Student Account payment is **due December 12**th. Please contact Student Accounts at 309-655-2344 to make payment arrangements. A monthly late charge of \$25 will be applied to any unpaid balance.
- Students enrolled in 6 credit hours or more may be eligible for federal student loans or other financial assistance. The FAFSA must be filed, and the financial aid process complete which may take several weeks. For more information, please contact the Student Finance Office at 309-624-9932.














S2 Registration Considerations
