- **A.** WORK LEFT TO COMPLETE (GAP, COOP, FATMAN, CHEMPACK & REGIONAL CACHE)
 - 1. There is still grant funding available from budget period four. Troy ordered tourniquets and trauma dressing with the extension funds that are still available.
 - 2. There was an idea about creating a medical emergency communication hub. He is currently modifying the war room located at the disaster preparedness office and he has ordered new radios.
 - 3. Your ideas are needed if you come up with any ideas that will benefit the region.

A. HHS-ASPR CAT

- 1. The assessment tool has been completed by the CILCARP governance committee for ASPR. They discussed the priorities coordinating Healthcare Respond Health and Safety, Strategy Resources & Commitments and Evaluation & Relocation. This has been submitted.

- 6. The first round of the beta test will begin March 9, 2018. He is looking for another champion to help assist with this.
