How to Write a Research Paper

- Identify and develop a topic
- Do a preliminary search for print and online resources
- Develop a thesis statement and supporting argument
- Make a tentative outline - introduction, body, and conclusion
- Evaluate and cite sources
- Organize notes, verify information, and document quotes
- Write first draft, revise, and proofread

Preliminary Steps

- Find a topic of interest from course reading assignments
- Scan relevant journals and books
- Decide on the subject matter of the paper
- Outline ideas to include in your outline
- Organize related ideas into sub-groups and arrange ideas into a hierarchy

How to Analyze a Research Article

- Abstract - brief article summary
- Introduction – topic identification
- Methods - description of research conducted
- Results - summarize data
- Discussion – statement of conclusions and implications
- References - biographic list of sources

Evaluate Sources

- **Currency** - Check the publication date and determine whether it is sufficiently current
- **Coverage (relevance)** - Consider whether the source is relevant to your research and whether it covers the topic adequately
- **Authority** - Discover the credentials of the authors of the source and determine their level of expertise and knowledge
- **Accuracy** - Consider whether the source presents accurate information and whether it can be verified
- **Objectivity (purpose)** - Think about the author's purpose in creating the source and consider how that affects its usefulness

Organize and Verify Information

- Keep a list and add sources as you find them
- Include sources from your background reading, online catalog, or library databases
- Include all citation information for each source
- Record URLs and dates of access for online sources

Cite Sources

- In APA, cite a source in the text and in the reference list.
- **In-text citations** include the author's surname and publication year. Page numbers are also added when quotes are referred to in the text.
- **Reference list** - each source you cite in the paper must appear in your reference list, each entry in the reference list must be cited in the text.

Write First Draft

- The introduction includes a general statement about the topic and ends with a more specific statement of the main idea
- The purpose of the introduction is to let the reader know what the topic is and how it will be presented
- The body consists of detailed development of ideas. Limit each paragraph to one main idea and use transition words to ensure a smooth flow of ideas between paragraphs
- The conclusion summarizes the discussion and restates the main idea
