## **Registration Process**

Students will register online in SONIS beginning Monday, October 6, 2025 at 8 am to Thursday, October 9, 2025 at 4 pm.

#### **Academic Advisement**

- All currently enrolled graduate students will receive an email from their academic advisor with courses to register for in SONIS based on their plan of study.
- It is the student's responsibility to contact their Academic Advisor with questions or to make changes to their plan of study.
- Choose classes by checking the Spring 2026 Class Schedule for the classes you need and the time and location most convenient.
- The 'hold' on registration will be released prior to online registration dates.
- Students will not be able to register if they have delinquent financial obligations to the College or to financial aid programs.
- The College reserves the right to limit enrollment in sections and to cancel a section for which there are insufficient registrations. The College reserves the right to change or adjust course, clinical or lab schedules of students, as needed.
   You will be notified of changes to your schedule via email.

#### **Student Account**

- Student Account payment is **due December 12**<sup>th</sup> **for the Spring 2026 semester**. Please contact Student Accounts at 309-655-2344 to make payment arrangements. A monthly late charge of \$25 will be applied to any unpaid balance.

#### **Course Formats**

Graduate courses are online and offered in the following formats:

- Asynchronous courses where the students and faculty are not in the course at the same time and do not meet live at all. The asynchronous format allows students to access the course and make their contributions on their own schedule. While the course has due dates for assignments and discussions, none of the class is conducted live. The asynchronous format is delivered using the College's learning management system (LMS). All assignments, discussions etc. are in the LMS.
- Hybrid courses are mostly asynchronous meaning students and faculty are not in
  the course at the same time but will meet live synchronously for some classes, via a
  videoconferencing system during the first week and additional times during the
  semester. The asynchronous portion of the class will be conducted using the
  College's learning management system (LMS). The synchronous portion of the
  class allows students to attend class in a live "classroom" setting from the comfort of
  their home or office.
- Synchronous courses where students and faculty are in the course at the same time and meet live each week via videoconferencing. The synchronous option allows students to attend class in a live "classroom" setting from the comfort of their home or office.
- Practicum courses are completed at a predetermined clinical site with a preceptor.
   Each practicum course requires completion of a different number of practicum hours. The number of required practicum hours is found in the course description located in the College Catalog.
- Faculty will notify students of live meeting dates. Any questions about meeting dates should be directed to the faculty teaching the course.

## **Minimum Computer Requirements**

All College of Nursing courses require the use of a computer and an email account. The student's computer must have adequate Internet bandwidth. Students may need to purchase a webcam and microphone if these features are not already built into the computer. Students are required to use an "appropriate headset" connected by USB and a microphone for all courses that use videoconferencing. The minimum computer requirements can be found in the current College of Nursing catalog or on the College website.
