Introduction

Saint Anthony College of Nursing (SACN) conducted the *Sexual Misconduct Climate Survey* in the Fall of 2024. This survey helps us better understand student perceptions as they relate to harassment based on gender or sex, stalking, domestic and dating violence, sexual violence, and how the campus faculty, staff, and peers would receive information about their experiences.

Illinois law (110 ILCS 155/35) requires all higher education institutions, including SACN, to conduct the Sexual Misconduct Campus Climate Survey annually to evaluate student perceptions of harassment based on gender or sex, stalking, domestic and dating violence, sexual violence, and how the campus faculty, staff, and peers would receive information about their experiences. While institutions are required to conduct the survey, student participation is voluntary and may be withdrawn at any time without penalty or prejudice. The *Sexual Misconduct Campus Climate Survey* is an important tool SACN uses for understanding and addressing institutional needs with regard to sexual harassment and sexual misconduct. Student participation in the survey helped us to be more aware of the issues we need to address and will help us craft the tools needed to address them.

Survey Administration

The *Sexual Misconduct Campus Climate Survey* was conducted by SACN during the Fall 2024 Semester. The purpose of the study was to provide information about the behaviors and perceptions that current students have related to SACN. Students were asked to complete a questionnaire concerning: relationships, sexual experiences, experiences with dating violence, and perceptions about safety at SACN during the last 12 months. SACN did give students the opportunity to submit a confirmation page for a chance to win SACN gear.

The Institutional Effectiveness department at SACN deployed the survey on October 7, 2024 and the survey was open until November 15, 2024. All currently enrolled students received a link to the survey and the survey via e-mail and the link to the survey was posted electronically on the Learning Management System. 263 students were invited to participate in the survey. Of those, 27 students filled out any of the survey at all, and 17 are reportable under the IBHE guidelines.

Survey Monkey was utilized as the administration platform. Question 4 of the base survey was modified to include an answer category for 2024. The base survey was not modified for any of the other modifiable questions (5, 7, 9, 18, 87, or 88).

Because of the content and nature of the survey, the following contacts were provided to students at the end of the survey as resources if the survey had evoked feelings of past negative experiences SACN's Title IX Coordinator Matt Young, <u>matthew.r.young@osfhealthcare.org</u>.

Results

Although there were not enough responses to meet the threshold, SACN Leadership reviewed the responses for any areas of concern or action.
